April is the surveyingest month

April of each year is Performance Evaluation Month for the Asheboro, Archdale and Seagrove libraries.

This budgetary feature was introduced three years ago by then County Manager Frank Willis and his assistant Will Massie, to tie organizational goals to budgetary expenditures.

Government wants to know: what services are needed, how they will be provided, how much they will cost, how well they are being provided and what has been accomplished by offering them. Every April we encourage patrons to fill out a one page survey of measures the library has set to ensure that the informational needs of every patron are met effectively and expeditiously.

Survey says: patrons are more than satisfied, rating our service as "excellent" a large percentage of the time. Beyond that, comments (and we are required to report them all!) from each library and section are overwhelmingly positive, focusing primarily on the all important human element of the equation. "Staff always friendly and helpful." "Everybody is friendly and professional." "Friendly, helpful staff, well-informed and knowledgeable." "You guys rock!"

It is gratifying to hear what we already knew reinforced in such a positive way. Our most important asset



is our staff. People are the key to a successful organization. Each and every organization, particularly in the service area, is acutely aware of this. Randolph County Government is proud of the fact that it not only hires quality people but the number of budgeted positions per 1,000 population is much lower than surrounding counties!

Speaking of quality people, Harriet Rietschel of the Archdale Library is retiring May 31 after 13 years. Originally from Maine where she worked in emergency services, she and her husband Carl moved here for better jobs and warmer weather. We will sorely miss her knowledge and her "warmth" (Look for a feature about Harriet in next month's newsletter).
