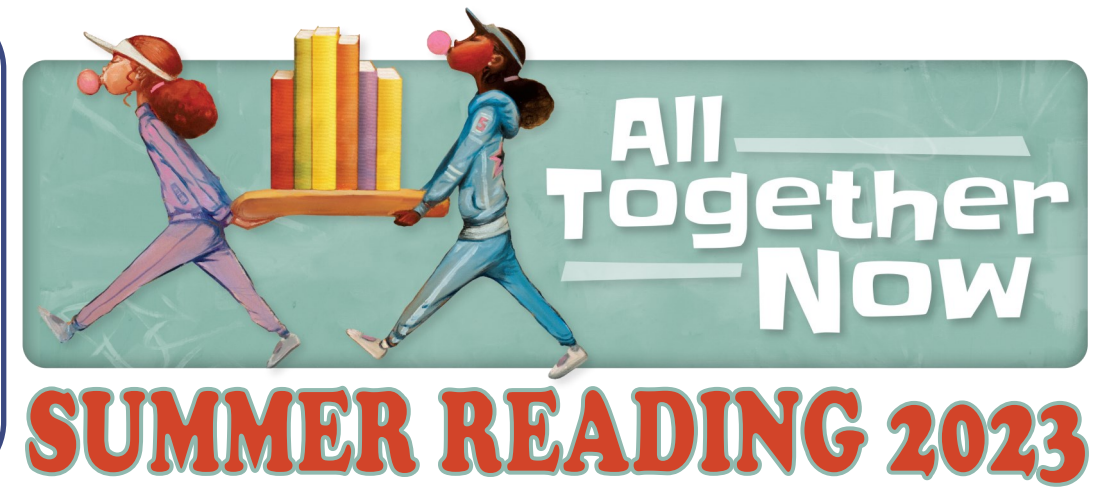

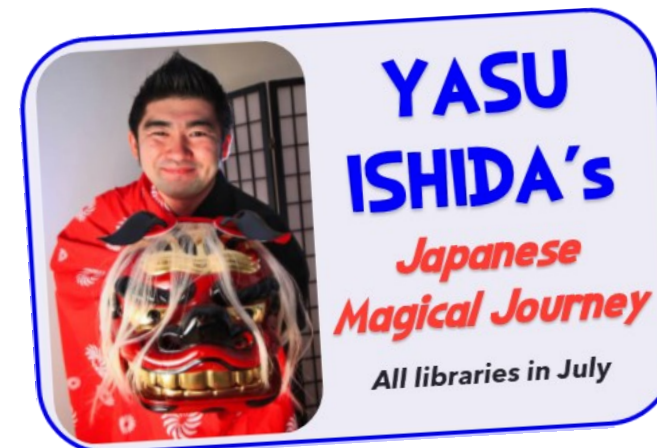

Summer to bring everyone 'All Together Now' for reading fun

Get "All Together Now" for interactive performances, learning opportunities, hands-on activities and more during a Summer Reading experience that offers children and teens a no-pressure way to stay engaged with learning while out of school, so they don't experience "summer slide" when they return in the fall. Adults, meanwhile, can enjoy speakers and other activities that enhance their reading experiences.



▲ At each library in June, children's entertainers **Criss Cross Mangosauce** will present a bilingual English/Spanish musical performance featuring riddles, songs, finger games, dramatic play and storytelling demonstrating biliteracy practices.

◀ Combining traditional Japanese theatre, lion dance, music, origami, magic and storytelling, **Yasu Ishida** will guide audiences to the enchanting land of Japan. From traditional folk tales to a Japanese vaudeville act playing a traditional flute, Yasu inspires lots of audience interaction and participation. All libraries in July.

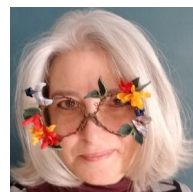

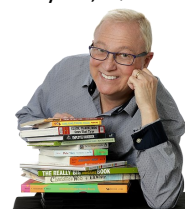

Juneteenth: Commemorating the end of Slavery

ASHEBORO, 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 15.

Returning Dr. Arwin Smallwood, professor and chair of the History Department at North Carolina A & T State University, details the history and importance of Juneteenth, which celebrates the proclamation ending enslavement on June 19, 1865. Smallwood will talk about the impact of slavery not just on African Americans, but on all Americans, and the historic efforts required to abolish it. He also will draw attention to enslavement in North Carolina and the over 5,000 African Americans and Native Americans who fought to end it and create better lives for themselves and all the people of the state after the Civil War.
