Keeping NC Weird!

Storyteller Liz Z Pardue shines light on state's mysteries

♣ Take a one-hour journey through the strangest history, most eccentric characters and darkest folklore of the Old North State on Thursday, June 4, at the Archdale and Asheboro libraries.

Join award-winning storyteller, writer and director Liz Z Pardue for "Keep NC Weird," a lively exploration of the bizarre, macabre and delightfully peculiar stories that make North Carolina unforgettable, 2 p.m. at the Archdale library and 6:30 p.m. at the Asheboro library.

Pardue, founder of Sisterhood of Spirits, LLC, operates ghost tours and spooky historical theatrical productions from her home in Fuquay-Varina, purported to be the most haunted small town in the South.

In the last year, she published her first book, *Fuquay-Varina Ghosts, Legends and Lore*, and performed at the North Carolina Storytelling Festival, the Bynum Front Porch Series, the Monti, and the Stone Soup Storytelling Festival, where she won both the Linda Goodman New Voices and People's Choice awards. Currently she is touring the state with her "Keep NC Weird" series.

Pottery Scratching: Dinosaur Edition, 6:30 p.m. Thursday, June 18, *OFF-SITE at the North Carolina Pottery Center*, 233 East Ave., Seagrove. Sgraffito, based on the Italian verb *graffiare* meaning "to scratch," is an artistic or decorative technique of scratching through a coating on a hard surface to reveal parts of an underlying layer contrasted in color. In this hands-on activity led by pottery educator Cat Viera Ackerman, participants will try their hand with the choice of scratching a T. rex or a triceratops. The Story Behind a Logo: Tile Stoves and the Mount Shepherd Potter, 7 p.m. Tuesday, June 23. Randolph County has used the clay stove tile designs found at the Mount Shepherd pottery site for both the 200th and 250th anniversary logos for the county. For 1976, the design was a soldier standing at attention, and in 2026 it is a dragoon on horseback. Both tiles were discovered during the 1970s, when an archaeological dig found numerous



artifacts from a pottery operated by Moravian potter Jacob Meyer during the Revolutionary War era. In this talk, Tara Logue, master potter and historian from Old Salem, will talk about the history of tile stoves, their design and construction, and how Meyer might have used his tile designs to market to new, patriotic buyers.
