Brendan Reichs, 'Virals' co-author, to visit library

♣Author Brendan Reichs will talk about his 'Virals' series of teen novels at 5 p.m. Tuesday, July 22, at the Asheboro library.

His talk, part of "Spark A Reaction," the Teen Summer Reading Program sponsored by the Friends of the Library, is free and the public is invited.

Reichs co-authors the series with his mom, famed "Bones" novelist Kathy Reichs. The Virals are a group of teens led by forensic anthropologist Temperance Brennan's niece Tory Brennan. Their exposure to a canine virus at an animal research facility has left them with heightened senses and animal-quick reflexes — leading them into all sorts of dangerous situations. Books in the series to date are *Virals, Seizure, Code* and *Exposure*.

Reichs, who grew up in Charlotte and graduated from Wake Forest University, left a career in the law to write. He lives in Charlotte with his wife Emily and their two children.

✤ We are fortunate to have working with us this summer Andrew Gavin, a rising senior at the N.C. School of Science and Math.

He's helping out in several areas, completing 60 hours of volunteer service required of NCSSM students.

The library was a natural choice for Andrew, considering his parents, Lee and

Roberta Gavin, are longtime library patrons, Friends and supporters. Lee is an attorney and district court judge, and Roberta is an elementary school media coordinator.

They come by their affinity for libraries naturally: Lee's father, Ed Gavin, was a lifelong library patron. Ed passed away on June 17 at age 93.

A Sanford native, Ed settled in Asheboro and practiced law here from 1948-2000. In 1960, he married Virginia Suiter; they have two sons, Lee and Ghio.

He served as Randolph County Attorney from 1985 to 1995, and in the 1950s was elected to three terms in the North Carolina House of Representatives.

Ed was a frequent library visitor. When he could no longer come to the library (only

Ed's commitment to the library also was evident through his long service on the Randolph Public Library Board of Trustees. Appointed in 1964, he served as chairman from 1978-1989 and left the board in 1991.

Current library board Chairman Ralph Hardison recalls Gavin as a caring person who took very seriously

anything with which he became involved.

Lee Gavin remembers growing up in a house filled with books. "From a very early age Mom and Dad read to us and we saw them reading which was an excellent example for us," he says.

"Dad mainly read history and biography. But he also read to learn about what he was interested in, constantly searching for more information.

"Even in his last days he had his caregivers looking up information on Google. As his eyesight failed the library provided him with audio books and he was proud when some of these were delivered by a summer intern by the name of Andrew Gavin!"
