An International Musical Journey: Trip to Ireland

6:30 p.m. Monday, June 18

Join us for an evening of Irish music and discussion. Travis Hicks will play Irish Traditional Music, including jigs, reels, hornpipes, and slow airs, on traditional hand-crafted instruments. With 18 years' experience on the Irish whistles and bagpipes, Hicks will play tunes and demonstrate the nuances of the Irish pipes, tin whistle, and anglo concertina in the Irish tradition. A question and answer session will follow this musical demonstration.

Hicks is an assistant professor of interior architecture at the University of North Carolina at Greensboro, and director of the Center for Community-Engaged Design. His appearance is sponsored by the Friends of the Library.

6:30 p.m. Thursday, July 26


