






Let us take time for all things; make us to grow calm, serene, gentle.


Teach us to put into action our better impulses, straightforward and unafraid.



What is Global ReLeaf?


Global ReLeaf is a national education, action, and policy campaign of the American Forestry Association aimed at improving the earth's environment through more and better trees and forests.





We had a very nice time at our November meeting at Shoney's in Thomasville. I was disappointed that more of our members were not in attendance.


