The following are the Petitioners names that were signed to the Regulator advertisment No. 9 from Orange county, N.C., written to the Governor(Tryon) and the Council etc. protesting taxes and fees. Before the Rev. War when the trouble was just beginning, Orange county was formed 1752. Guilford county was formed 1770 from Orange and Rowan(1753) and Randolph county was formed from Guilford 1779.

This was written about 1768. This does not mean they served in the Rev. War.

ST. PAUL METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH CEMETERY

"St. Paul Cemetery"

This list is not complete; there are many many graves throughout the cemetery that are not marked. It is told that some of the graves near the center of the cemetery, where there is much open space, are the graves of slaves. There are three or four tombstones that are so dim and weathered by time that they cannot be read.

Many Confederate and two Union Soldiers are buried here. The military markers at the Confederate and Union graves were erected by my husband, the late Alton F. Culver. His grandfathers, Edward Flowers Culver and Rev. Allen Norris, were Confederate soldiers of Georgia. The Union soldiers buried here are the grandfathers of one of our members, Miss Evelyn Story.

St. Paul Museum and cemetery has many visitors. Most every day there is someone there to make pictures, visit the graves of loved ones, and others seeking family information. Last year several groups from the Randleman School visited the Museum. Over the past year we have had out of state visitors from California, Florida, Georgia, Kansas, Michigan, New Jersey, Ohio, Texas, Virginia and Washington, D. C.

My father, Eugene Lassiter, who is in his eighty-eighth year, my uncle, T. E. (Tom) and aunt, Cordia Farlow Lassiter have been most helpful in supplying family connections. Also many others have helped.

My first remembrance of a funeral at St. Paul was going to the funeral of my great-aunt, Queen Nance Brookshire along with my mother, father, and baby sister, Eugenia (now Mrs. Paul Bell). All that stands out in my memory of that funeral was seeing so many people.

I remember hearing my mother, Alice Farlow Lassiter, my aunts, Julia F. Barker, Joanna F. Reams and Cordia F. Lassiter, and also my Grandmother Lassiter talk of family "connections" among the Lassiters, Farlows, Steeds, Nances, Davidsons, Beans, Brookshires, Hughes and many other related families. Then, too, considering the fact that I never missed a funeral at St. Paul when I was a child, I can well remember many of those that have long been gone.

St. Paul cemetery is a quiet peaceful spot on a busy, much traveled street. In the early 1800's, before the Mills or covered bridges were built, a road ran from the old County Home, west of Asheboro, to New Salem and joined the old Greensboro Road and the old Salisbury-Hillsborough Road. The branch (creek) below the cemetery was a ford and the road came up and across the lower part of the cemetery, across the T. E. Lassiter land and on across the S. E. Kirkman property coming out at Mount Lebanon Methodist Church.

Each grave tells a story of a life that was lived, whether it was short or the biblically allotted three score and ten. My beloved husband, Alton, my mother, and five generations of my people of the Farlow-Davidson line are buried there, and four generations of the Lassiter line. So it is with a feeling of love and reverence for these and all the many others that the reading of this cemetery has been done.

Benjamin Hill Lassiter was born in lower Randolph county near Lassiter's Mill. He was one of five sons and two daughters of Jesse Lassiter. The names of the others were Thomas Henderson, Henry, Jesse, Jake and the two daughters were Celie and Tiant (these may have been nicknames) Celie md Neal Wafford or Watford.

Benjamin enlisted in the Confederate army June 18 1861 at the age of 23. His records show that he was in 13 major battles, brave and attentive as a soldier. He was in Pickett's charge at Gettysburg, Pa. along with two brothers Henry and Thomas, all three survived this battle. He was captured later at Hatcher's Run, Va. and was a prisoner of war at Hart's Island in New York Harbor until his release June 19 1865. Jake, the youngest brother did not survive the war. He was killed in battle shortly after he enlisted.

On Dec. 19 1867 he was married to Margaret Sirona Nance. Six sons and three daughters were born of this marriage: William Reid md Lula McDaniel of Va. Fannie Rose md James Vancannon, Claudia Elizabeth md Edgar Reid, Ella Lovenia md William Lamb, John Lewis md Millie Lineberry, Jesse Lindsey md Mary Jane McIlwain of Miss., Alva Eugene md Mary Alice Elizebeth Farlow, Rossa Edgar md Jessie Kate Culver of Ga. and Thomas E. md Cordia Farlow.

The North Randolph Historical Society Museum is the former St. Paul Methodist Episcopal Church, South. It is located on High Point Street, a few blocks off Main Street. It sits on the bank of the street with several feet of ground space on each side and in front with the steps leading directly into the street.
