


INFORMATION ON JOINING THE SOCIETY

Our Society is a non-profit corporation, chartered under the laws of the state of North Carolina. Gifts to the Society are tax deductible. Memberships are of several classifications. Individual (\$5.00 per year) Junior (\$2.00 per year) Contributing (\$25.00 per year) and Sustaining (\$50.00 per year).

Aim: To preserve the St. Paul Church building and other buildings and sites within the Society's area. To establish a Museum and acquire, through gifts, articles and items pertaining to the life and times of the people of the Society's area. To collect historical and genealogical data for permanent record.

Regular Meetings: of the Society shall be held every other month, beginning with January, the Society's new year. Special meetings shall be called when necessary. The Board of Directors meeting every other month, also.

Membership Dues: are per calendar year per person. Membership entitles members to copies of the Society's Quarterly, use of materials and books in its Library. Books or Booklets printed for sale, by the Society, when not sent free to members, are not included in the membership dues. Dear Members,

Late again, but we hope you will enjoy this Quarterly. Several stencils have already been prepared for the Winter issue so that should reach you by Christmas.

Promises! We are learning. We promised several Family Histories before we saw the material. Some will take much work and we have dropped that for the present as we do not have the time to write and hunt for much information that is needed. We do have members of the families helping us as they can and hope to run them later. Some was found to be incorrect and we hope to get that straightened out when we can spend time at the court house or find members that have correct material. Some we are holding back as we get new material that is connecting with it. So for the present we will not be printing the : Vickory, Pugh, Spoon and others mentioned.

Promises! We do promise to print, at least, two more lines of Julian material possibly next spring. We have the Clapp family history being prepared for us, also Martindale, Lee, Lineberry, the December issue will begin coping the complete book: ALLRED 1553-1961. Mr. Renne Allred, Jr. P.O. Boc 1079, Bowie, Texas 76230 has given us permission to copy any or all of the material. He placed one of the books in our Library. Of course we can't copy the wonderful pictures that show the old home-place of the Allred's and many family pictures but we feel even the letters that are inserted in the book are of interest. We are very grateful to Mr. Allred. There are 54 pages so we will have to continue the material in several Quarterlies. Then we hope to run all material, from all persons, asking of Allred's or connected with them, which might be of help to some.

Mr. William Mendenhall, again, has been most gracious to us and placed in our Library, "The Beeson-Beeson Family". We appreciate the book so much. He sent us a picture of his grandfather, Alpheus L. Mendenhall and a write-up of William E. Hinshaw, 1st Mayor Of Signal Hill, Los Angeles, Calif. (Mr. William Mendenhall has been Mayor also.) William E. Hinshaw's parents were from Randolph county. We will print this in a latter issue.

Many have written asking of the Districts N.C. was divided into Rev. War time etc. We have those and if they are not in December's issue they will be run in the Spring issue. We have many church histories and cemetery records that we are trying to arrange for printing and we are working on two new ideas to help "speed" gathering of material. One, we are preparing several columns to present to our local county paper and see if they will let us print a regular, "Genealogy" column, once a week. This would reach many more of our people and we might find original material. Two; we have just begun to collect material for a handbook of "Reunions", held in Rand. county each year. We hope to print a little of the family, when and where the Reunions are held and officers, who one may write too. If you are interested, write and ask for the family-if local persons attend or know of one, please let us know!!

From Mrs. Ray Cashatt's files. Used to try placing Randolph county people during the Rev. War. So many persons have commented favorably on Vol. 3 No. 2-Summer 1969- File of Orange county, N.C. petitioners names that were listed as signed to the Regulator advertisement No. 9 that I feel the following may be of interest and help in placing persons of this area. This does not mean they served in the Rev. War!

(Regulator Advertisement No. 8)

At a general meeting of the Regulators, on April 30, 1768, 12 men were appointed to meet with the Governor's committee and see if they could settle "matters." They were to meet 11 May at Thomas Lindley's. They were:

"Appointed Settlers"

At a convention of "Regulators & Associates", held at George Adam Sallings (Sally's) on Rocky River, 30 April, 1768, the articles of Settlement and Oath were agreed upon, dated "October ye 9th, 1769, and signed by the following from Anson county, N.C.

Randolph county was formed 1779 from Guilford; Orange county was formed 1752; Guilford county was formed 1770 from Orange county and from Rowan (1753) and Rowan from Anson (1750). So, 29 years before all were listed Anson-or most-Many Randolph county records will be found in Anson and Rowan counties.

Julian Coat-of-Arms

Arms: Argent a cross crosslet in saltire sable.

Crest: On a chapeau gules turned up ermine a salamander
in flames proper.

The town of St. Julian is an old Roman city in Brittany, France,
near the Normandy border.

JULIAN

Count Rene de St. Julian was born in France around 1670. He was a French Huguenot. In 1685 King Louis XIV of France revoked the Edict of Nantes, the gracious decree by which Henry IV guaranteed religious freedom to the French Protestants, by this cruel measure as many as three hundred thousand Huguenots were driven from the kingdom. In 1686 Count Rene de St. Julian fled from France to Ireland. After the "Glorious Revolution" of 1688 brought William and Mary to the throne of England he joined the English army and was an officer in the army of William of Orange at the Battle of the Boyne in 1690, when James II and his army were defeated.

In 1700 Count Rene de St. Julian came to South Carolina by way of the West Indies. On the way over he met and married an English girl, Mary Bulloch. After coming to America he shortened his name to Rene Julian.

They lived in South Carolina some years, later he moved his family to Cecil County, Maryland, then in 1735 moved to Frederick County, Virginia.

He died after 1744 at Winchester, Virginia and was buried in Opoquon Graveyard. The graves were destroyed during the Civil War by the Confederate soldiers who were camped near and used the fenced enclosure for a horse pasture.

From St. Ann's Parish Register, (Maryland)

"December 30th, 1716, Was Born Isaac Julian, Son of Rene and Mary Julian."

About 1760, after Braddock's defeat in the French and Indian War, on account of the danger from Indians and with no protection on the frontier, Isaac and his brothers brought their families south into North Carolina. Isaac settled on the "Waters of Deep River". He married Barbara White, daughter of Dr. Robert White and Margaret Hoge White of Winchester, Virginia.

2- Isaac, Jr., m Sarah Long.

3- Mary, m Nehemiah O'Dell

Isaac Julian, Sr. died from a poison snake bite. He and his wife and John are buried in the old Trogdon Graveyard beside the road to Gray's Chapel, Randolph Co. /N.C.

Isaac Julian, Jr. was born in 1757 in Virginia. He was about four years of age when the family moved to North Carolina. He married Sarah Long, 1759-1845, who was born in Penn. She was the daughter of Tobias Long, who married Martha Robinson Rich, widow of Peter.

Tobias Long was a son of Edward Long who came to this country with William Penn's fleet in 1682.

Isaac Julian, Jr. and family lived on a farm on Deep River. He sold the farm to a William Hinshaw in 1813, and all the family went to Indiana except the two oldest boys, Bohan and Tobias, who were already married and settled in Randolph county, N.C.

Isaac Julian, Jr. died July 8, 1831, in Henry County, Indiana. He and his wife both died and are buried in Indiana.

Isaac Julian, 3rd and Rebecca Hoover Julian were the parents of The Hon. George W. Julian, 1817-1899, who was a member of the United States Congress from Indiana, during the Civil War, was Surveyor-General of New Mexico in 1885, and was author of a number of books.

Bohan Julian, Esq. was born Aug 22, 1777, died March 28, 1861. Married Nov 14, 1803. Jane White, b Feb 17, 1787, d April 12, 1869.

Bohan Julian, Esq. was a successful farmer and cabinet maker. He lived on the plantation of his grandfather, Isaac Julian, Sr. Nearby, the old Revolutionary Road, down Deep River in Randolph County, N.C., down which General Green's army traveled that stormy March of 1781.

Alfred Julian was born Feb 18, 1820, died Sept 19, 1876. He married Mary Ann Ward, 1824-1890, dau of Hardy and Mary Ann Jones Ward.

Alfred lived and raised his family on a large farm near Millboro(Randolph Co.), N.C., part of the old plantation of his great-grandfather Isaac Julian, Sr.

He died of typhoid fever at the age of 56 and is buried at New Salem cemetery. His wife lived to be 66 and is buried at Bethany Methodist Church near Worthville, (Randolph Co.), N.C.

Death of a Wayne County Pioneer

Shubal Julian, who settled in Wayne County in 1813, quietly passes away.

Died on the morning of the 12th inst., at his late residence in Cadis, Henry County, Indiana, Shubal Julian, aged ninety-four years, less one month and two days, his birthday having been April 14, 1792.

At his death he was the oldest man in Henry County, and one of the oldest inhabitants of the state, in the county, having settled in the territory in 1813, and thenceforward having been a citizen, first of Wayne, and then of Henry County.

Shubal Julian belonged to a large and well-known family, who were descended from the French, settled first in South Carolina, whither they fled when expelled from France on account of their religious views. Subsequently the family removed to Virginia, settling near Winchester, where they continued to reside until after Braddock's defeat, when, to avoid trouble with the Indians, they removed to Guilford County, North Carolina.

Isaac Julian, the father of subject of this notice, had twelve sons and daughters, all of whom, together with himself, at various times between 1808 and 1815 made their home in Wayne County, Indiana, except his two oldest sons, who remained in

their native State.

Isaac Julian, a son of his, the father of Judge J. B. Julian and the Hon. Geo. W. Julian of Indianapolis, became at an early day one of the prominent men of Wayne County, dying in the prime of life. Rene Julian, another son, the first Clerk of the Henry Circuit Court, also died young, as did two of the youngest daughters. Of the eight remaining children, including the subject of this notice, who lived to be near ninety-four years of age, is stated another one, a daughter, died a few years ago in Richmond, at the age of ninety-three, and daughters yet remain, one aged ninety-two and the other over ninety years, the four averaging ninety-two years. The remaining four died at ages ranging between eighty-five and eighty-nine, the average age of the eight over ninety years. The family in point longevity is rarely equaled.

Shubal Julian lived almost through the entire lifetime of the Constitution, He was nearly as old as it was, and from a population of about four million he saw its growth to near fifty-nine millions.

Shubal Julian was an upright man, a Christian gentleman, fond of books and well informed, he was a good talker, a pleasant companion and a welcomed visitor everywhere. He was beloved by all who knew him, and no man in the community in which he lived, it is safe to say, would be more missed or regretted than he will be. He was the grandfather of Mrs. Dr. Hasty and Mrs. Barth of Indianapolis, and the uncle of George W. and Isaac Julian, formerly of this city.

(Shubal Julian was a brother of Bohan Julian, 1777-1861.)

Vol. III-No. I 1969 printed a letter from a Quaker girl out west. Miss Lona B. Wood explained it to me: "The writer of the letter, Mary Hadley, was a daughter of Tobias Julian (1779-1852) and Ester Morgan Julian who are buried in New Salem Cem. She was writing to my Great-great-grandfather, Bohan Julian (1777-1861) who with his wife are buried at New Salem. The brother she mentioned was Howgil Julian who was one of the Trustees of Mt. Lebanon Church, Randleman, N.C. to whom the land was deeded in 1849. When the corner stone was laid in 1963 for the new church, a picture of Howgil Julian and his wife were among the items placed inside." (Ed. We plan to print the history and cemetery records of Mt. 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ATWOOD AND WOOD

Atwood and Wood Coat-of-Arms

Arms: Gules a lion rampant argent between six acrons slipped or.

Crest: A cubit arm in armour erect argent holding in the hand proper a battle-axe.

WOOD

The founder of this family in America was Henry Atwood. Born at Sanderstead Manor, Surry, England. Came to Plymouth Colony, Mass. in the year 1635. After coming to America he shortened his name to Wood, but in his will he used both names. Some of his children kept the name Atwood.

Henry Wood and Abigail Jenny were married April 28, 1644.

Abigail was born of Pilgrim parents at Leyden, Holland. Daughter of John and Sarah Cary Jenny who were part of a band of religious Separatists that sailed from England to Amsterdam, Holland before 1608. From there they went to Leyden where they lived until coming to Plymouth, Mass. in 1623 on :

"The good ship, Little James, Emanuel Altham, Captain, and John Bridges, Master.

She was a new vessel of forty-four tons, built by the Plymouth Adventurers to remain at the Colony. She was three months in the crossing. All the passengers settled at Plymouth."

John Jenney (supposed to have been part owner of the ship) in 1637 had a new "barque", and in 1641 joined in building ships. He was Assistant to the Governor in 1637-38-40, and Deputy to General Courts.

His will names his children: Samuel, Abigail, John and Susan and wife Sarah.

"I do ordain my worthy friends, William Bradford, Gov. of Plymouth Colony, and Thomas Pence of same, Overseers of this my last will and Testament."

Henry Wood was also a well-known man in Plymouth Colony. He was a surveyer of highways from 1655 to 1659. He helped build the first sawmill in Middleboro. Was a member of the Commandant's Council and also served at various times in the Courts of the Colony. He was a member of the Grand Inquest in 1648, '56, and 1668.

Henry Wood died at Middleboro in 1670. An inventory of his property is on file at Plymouth:

"A tru Inventory of the goods and chattles of Henry Wood of the Town of Middleboro in the Jurisdiction of Plymouth in New England."

Zebedee Wood also had several land grants.

In 1784 Zebedee Wood was one of 3 Commissioners who purchased 5 acres of land for the court house and other public buildings of the first county seat of Randolph County, which was formed in 1779, and in 1788 was one of the five first town commissioners who named the town Johnsonville(Johnstonville)

In 1787 he was one of the 4 Justices before whom Andrew Jackson qualified to practice law in Randolph county.

Zebedee Wood served in the House of Commons 3 terms, 1786,1788,1789, and served 2 terms in the State Senate, 1791 and 1792.

Zebedee Wood was a delegate from Randolph county to the Constitutional Convention at Hillsborough in 1788. After voting not to enter the Union, the Convention and State Legislature selected a place for a permanent Capitol and the Legislature of 1791-92 bought the land for the city of Raleigh.

He was, also, a delegate to the Convention at Fayetteville in 1789 when the Constitution was ratified on Nov. 21, and twenty days later they passed the act to establish the University at Chapel Hill, N.C.

David Fanning and his band of Tories, had at one time, a camp on Sandy Creek, near what is now Nixon's Mill in Randolph County(1969). On March 17, 1781, the day Zebedee Wood's daughter, Nancy, was born, two days after the Battle of Guilford Court House, David Fanning and his men came hunting Zebedee. They failed to find him but the Tories raided the house and took everything of value.

Samuel Wood born April 22, 1783, died Dec 20,1862. Married Verlinda Smith, born Sept 7,1785, died July 21,1870.

Samuel Wood owned a large tract of land on the "Waters of Sandy Creek." Probably a part of his father's estate.

Near his home was Wood School House. In 1832-33, the Rev. Brantley York preached here and held a revival meeting. He wrote,"From the fruits of this revival a society was formed and a new church was erected called Randolph Church."

Samuel Wood gave the land upon which the church was built and he and his wife, Verlinda, helped in organizing the church and were active charter members. Both lie buried in the little cemetery-enclosed by a wrought iron fence-across the road from the present church.

Verlinda Smith was a daughter of Alexander Smith and Keziah Lamar Smith of near Gladesboro, in upper Randolph County. Alexander Smith was a soldier of the Continental Line during the Revolutionary War. He and Keziah had nine children, all daughters, who married into well known families of Randolph County. They lived on a large farm near Sandy Creek adjoining his fathers land.

"Henderson Wood was prosperous for that day and time. He owned several teams of horses and wagoned to Fayetteville. They loaded the wagons with products from the farms to trade or sell in Fayetteville and brought back household and farm supplies!"

Henderson Wood died at the age of forty years, leaving Hannah with seven children to rear. One of her brothers took care of the farm for her.

During a diphtheria epidemic in 1855, Hannah lost three of her children in four days time.

Her oldest son, 18 year old, Alexander Smith Wood, joined the Confederate Army in the spring of 1862. After fighting one battle after another with Stonewall Jackson's men in the Valley of Virginia during the summer, he was wounded at the Battle of Harpers Ferry in Virginia Sept. 1862, died and was buried at Winchester, Virginia.

After the war her eldest daughter, Martha Jane, who was soon to have been married, died of pueumonia.

Henderson Wood and four children are buried at Randolph Church.

In 1874, Hannah Wood with her remaining daughter, Nancy, and son, John, his wife and baby, moved to Watauga County in the Blue Ridge Mountains of North Carolina. She lived there until her death in 1893. She lies buried in the Mast Family Cemetery on top of a beautiful little mountain near Valle Crucis.

Hannah Hardin Wood was the daughter of Mark Hardin, 1788-1862, and Sarah York Hardin, 1785-1861.

Mark Hardin was a charter member of Gray's Chapel Methodist Church, and was one of the trustees who bought the land for the church in 1834. Mark Hardin and his wife are buried in the cemetery there.

Sarah York Hardin was a daughter of William York who in 1777 enlisted in the 1st N. C. Regiment of the Continental Line, to serve for the duration of the Rev. War.

Eli York, youngest brother of William York, said he was on his way to visit his older brothers at the American camp when he heard the thunder of the big guns at the Battle of Guilford Court House on March 15, 1781.

Their first son was born in Randolph county April 19, 1873, soon after that they sold their land and moved to a mountain home near Valle Crucis, Watauga county, N.C. and lived there until 1889 when they bought a farm near Deep River and moved back to Randolph county.

John Wood died at the age of 60 and was buried at Bethany Methodist Church, in Randolph county. Mary lived to be almost 80 and is buried at Bethany beside her husband.

John Hilliard Hill was a native of Davidson County, N.C. and was a veteran of the Confederate Army, (1864-65), Co. A, 40th Reg't. (Artillery) N.C. Troops, C.S.A.

Sarah Jane Robbins was a dau of the Rev. Joshua Robbins, Methodist Minister, who preached at Old Union Methodist Church (Randolph Co.) around 1850.

John and Sarah Hill lie buried in the Worthville Cemetery on a slope above Deep River.

William Julian Wood was a carpenter and builder. He could, also, make beautiful handmade furniture. All his life he enjoyed reading and particularly anything of historic interest. He had a good memory and liked to tell of things that happened long ago. He was a good man and lived a long, busy, useful life. He died at the age 83 years and is buried beside his wife in the beautiful country cemetery at Gray's Chapel Methodist Church, Randolph County, N.C.
