INFORMATION ON JOINING THE SOCIETY

Our Society is a non-profit corporation, chartered under the laws of the state of North Carolina. Gifts to the Society are tax deductible. Memberships are of several classifications. Individual (\$5.00 per year), Junior (\$2.00 per year), Contributing (\$25.00 per year) and Sustaining (\$50.00).

Aim: To preserve the St. Paul Church building and other buildings and sites within the Society's area. To establish a Museum and acquire, through gifts, articles and items pertaining to the life and times of the people of the Society's area. To collect historical and genealogical data for permanent record.

Regular Meetings: of the Society shall be held every other month, beginning with January, the Society's new year. Special meetings shall be called when necessary. The Board of Directors meeting every other month, also.

Membership Dues: are per calendar year per person. Membership entitles members to copies of the Society's Quarterly, use of materials and books in its Library, at the Library in the Museum. PATRICK HENLEY AND PROGENY --- by P. D. Owen Greensboro, North Carolina

Wife Sarah and their son John in company with William Penn sailed England to U. S. of America; they landed in Philadelphia, Penn. Oct. 20, 1682; later two daughters were born to them viz; Mary and Elizabeth. John Henley only son of Patrick and Sarah Henley married Isabella Newby of Albemarle Co., N. C. their progeny was: John, Mary, William and Elizabeth.

John Henley son of John and Isabella Newby Henley married Mary Jordan of Albemarle Co., N. C. their progeny was John, Jesse, Joseph and Mary also Millicent. John Henley, brother of Jesse and son of John and Mary Jordan of Albemarle Co., N. C., married Mary Albertson. They located in southern part of Randolph County; their progeny was Henry who married Martha Sanders; John who married Susana Hubbard. Joseph, Panina Morgan. Jesse who married Miram Pundy; Gabriel married Mary Pundy; Micajah married Guelma Charles; Elias married Jane Hubbard; Mary married Aaron Hill; Lydia married John Lassiter -- all of Randolph County, N. C.

Jesse Henley of Albemarle Co., N. C. brother of John Henley married Ann Pretlaw of Surry Co., Va. member of Friends Church at Blacksburg, Va. All located in Randolph Co., N. C.; their progeny John Henley born 1760 who married Kissia Richardson. Isabella Henley never married was born 1761. Millicent born 1768. Jesse Henley, Jr. born 1770 married Katherin Younts. Gabriel Henley born 1772 married Mary Pundy; Agatha Henley 1773 married Judia Hussy. Stephen Henley born 1774 married Anna Pearson. Jesse Henley and wife Ann Pretlaw located near Center of Randolph Co. near Back Creek Church. Jesse Henley lived and died in Randolph County. Anna Pearson Henley was wife of Stephen Henley daughter of Nathan and Sallie Symond Pearson of Back Creek, Randolph Co., N. C.

Stephen Henley and Anna Pearson were married in 1798. Stephen Henley died 9 mo. 10th day, 1820. Anna Pearson Henley born 12-23-1779, their progeny 7 sons and 2 daughters, she (Anna) died 9-10-1872. Nathan Pearson Henley born Jan. 24, 1801; Rebecca Henley Hodgins born June 18, 1802; Jesse Henley, Jr. born Sept. 10, 1804; Abram Henley born Aug. 10, 1806; Henry Henley born Sept. 21, 1808; Stephen Henley born Oct. 5, 1810; Mathew Henley born March 1, 1813, Anna Davis Henley born June 8, 1816, David V. Henley born Oct. 20, 1818.

Sarah Symond was born on the island of Nantucket in the year 1779. In child-

hood the family moved to Symonds Creek Meeting in Pasquotank Co., N. C. in the year 12-21-1794. A certificate was granted for their removal to Back Creek in Randolph Co., N. C. These extracts copied from Book No. 2 (now in Library Hall of History at Raleigh, N. C.). All other books of Minutes supposed to be in the vault in the Library at Guilford College.

Stephen Henley and other relations were buried in a family burying ground near the house, their home. This became a burying ground for neighbors without restriction or cost. Part of the lot was given freely for the burial of colored people either slaves or free.

Anna Henley wife of Stephen after spending several years with son David V. Henley and Daughter Anna Davis alternately died and was buried at Deep River, N. C. Guilford Co. in a lot later used for the burial of David V. Henley and wife Eleanor and their infant son David V. Jr.

Patrick Henley was buried in Friends Cemetery at Philadelphia 2-28-1698. John Henley, son of Patrick, lived and died in Pasquotank Co., N. C. Patrick Henley's brother Robert was Lord Chancellor of England when he, Patrick, came to this country. Peter Henley from London, England by authority of British Government was made Chief Justice of North Carolina. Peter Henley died 4-25-1738, was buried at Edenton, N. C. David V. Henley, son of Stephen and Anna Pearson Henley, was married to Eleanor Lassiter in March 1844, their progeny as follows:

ated on the banks of the Yadkin River near Wilkesboro. Hugh Montgomery deeded another farm to Rachel Montgomery, another daughter who married Montfort Stokes, Gov. of N. C. 1830-1832. Rachel's farm was just across the river from Rebecca's place. Elisha Mendenhall Welborn, son of Joseph Welborn and Parthenia Gray Saxton of Randolph N. C. moved to Wilkes Co. N. C. about 1855 and later rented the Gen. James Welborn farm from Samuel Chapley Welborn's widow. After the death of Gen. James Welborn 1854, his son Samuel Chapley Welborn owned it. After death of Samuel Chapley Welborn his widow wanted to go back to her people in Tenn. so rented farm to Elisha Mendenhall Welborn. Samuel Chapley Welborn and wife Mary Stearns had two children. One son died young and is buried at the old home place near Wilkesboro N. C. The other child Rebecca Jane, married a King of Nashville Tenn. King died and Rebecca later married Ridley. There was one son by King and several by Ridley. Rebecca's health had failed and Ridley persuaded her to sell her grandfather's place (home place of Gen. James Welborn) on Yadkin River. Wm. Henderson and brother Ruffin bought it.

Wm. Henderson had a daughter who married L. S. Benbow, and the farm was willed to her. Sewell Welborn, son of Elisha Mendenhall Welborn, bought the old Gen. James Welborn farm from Mrs. L. S. Benbow. Sewall Welborn was a man of great height and powerful build. His grave is over nine feet long.

The farm known as Gen. James Welborn place, later called Sewell Welborn place, was a 42,000 acre tract granted to the moravians who came south and settled near Wilkesboro to pursue the pottery trade but finding the climate too cold they sold the 42,000 acre tract to Hugh Montgomery of Salisbury N. C. Hugh Montgomery had two daughters - twins - Rebecca and Rachel. Rebecca married Gen. James Welborn and Rachel married Gov. Montfort Stokes. Hugh Montgomery deeded the 42,000 acre tract to his wife the mother of Rebecca and Rachel. They inherited the land from their mother. The Welborn farm on one side of the River (Yadkin) and the Montfort Stokes farm on the other. The two homes were about two miles apart but were within seeing distance.

After the Moravians left their first settlement at Moravian Falls near Wilkesboro, they bought 1,000 acres near Old Salem, then called Noddiopia. They paid one dollar per acre for this tract. Later they moved into Salem (now the town of Winston Salem) and established the Salem Academy.

Hugh Montgomery was born in Ireland. He fell in love with a Miss Moore of noble birth. Her friends objected to her marrying him but she was secretly conveyed aboard a ship where she met her lover and was married. They escaped safely to America and settled in Penn. Later moved to Rowan Co. N. C. Hugh died Dec. 23, 1779 leaving one son and seven daughters. His only son Hugh Jr. married a Miss Parnell of Virginia. By her he had seven children one of whom was Col. Samuel Montgomery of the 39th U. S. Infantry. He was killed in the battle of Horseshoe Mar. 27, 1814, age 25. The oldest daughter of Hugh Montgomery Sr. married Dr. Anthony Newman of Nashville Tenn. Samuel Daniel Newman, son of Dr. A. Newman, was born in N. C. moved to Ga. was Lieut. of 4th regular Army and com-Georgia volunteers in action with Florida Indians in 1813. Was wounded at camp Defiance. Jan. 1814. Was a member of Georgia congress 1831-1833. Died Walker Co. Ga. 1851.

The second daughter married a Mr. Stewart of Greensboro Tenn. The third daughter married a Mr. Blake whose Grandson James Blake distinguished himself in the war with Mexico under Gen. Taylor.

The fourth daughter married Capt. Edward Ingram of Richmond Co. He was first a private and later a captain in the Revolutionary War. Was grandfather of Major Saunders Ingram of Richmond.

The fifth daughter married Col. David Campbell who was in the battle of Kings Mountain. Moved to Tenn. established Campbell's station, was Col. in Mexican War, was Gov. of Tenn. 1850-1853. In 1862 was appointed Brig. Gen. of Union Army but declined on account of bad health. Was a member of congress 1865-1867, died in Tenn. Aug. 19, 1867.

The sixth daughter married Gen. James Welborn of Wilkes Co. N. C. whose eldest daughter married Newton Cannon Gov. of Tenn.

The seventh daughter married Montfort Stokes Gov. of N. C.

Hugh Montgomery Sr. was of good Birth and was closely related to Gen. Richard Montgomery who was killed in the Battle of Quebec Dec. 1, 1775. Hugh came to America a poor man but by hard work and aggressiveness accumulated a handsome estate.

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DEDICATION OF BELL AND

WELBORN GRAVE YARD

"Following is the paper read by Dr. J. E. Pritchard at the dedication of the marker to the Bell and Welborn grave yard on November 12, 1953.

It does not seem necessary for me to remind any audience in this section of Randolph county that we are today standing on sacred and holy ground. A great many things of great importance took place on some particular spot and it is possible to locate that spot definitely. But in this community it is a section rather than a spot that is sacred. Within less than three miles from here is where the first court in Randolph county was held. Those of us who are living now are greatly indebted to those who have gone before us for preserving information which we cherish today. Had they not written down these things all that we would know today would be by tradition and when anything is handed down from one generation to another sometimes the facts in the case are difficult to determine. First I should like to acknowledge my indebtedness to the late J. Addison Blair for his reminiscences of Randolph county, published in 1890.

Since Mr. Blair mentions so many things of interest to this community it seems wise to quote rather freely from his history. Listen to what he says:

'The legislature of 1779, then sitting at Halifax, passed an act providing for the formation of a new county out of Guilford and Rowan, to be called Randolph. Notice having been given, the citizens met accordingly on Monday, the 8th day of March, 1779, at the house of Abram Reece who then lived on the place now owned by Elias Allred, about half way between Brown's Cross Roads and Randleman factory. Proclamation having been made, the act of the assembly was read wherein William Cole, John Collins, Joseph Hinds, Jacob Sheppard, Richardson Owen, Windsor Pearce, William Tell, William Merrill, John Lowe, Enoch Davis and James Hunter were nominated Justices for holding the courts in said county. The oath of allegiance and the oath of office was administered by William Cole, Esq. whereupon they took their seats and organized and held the first court in Randolph county by electing William Bell, sheriff; William Millikan, register of deeds; and Absolom Tatum, clerk.'

According to Mr. Blair, three courts were held in the home of Mr. Reece. Then he says that a small log house was built about four hundred yards of the cross roads, on the lands of Stephen Rigdon and the fourth court was held here on December 13, 1779.

This house, Mr. Blair says, was called the Randolph courthouse and was in fact the first court house in the county, though the title remained in Rigdon. Mr. Blair says further that in 1784 Mr. Stephen Rigdon sold to Zebidee Wood, Robert McLean and

and James Dougan, commissioners, five acres of land on which to erect public buildings.

This paragraph from Blair's history is of particular interest:

'In 1788 the legislature, then sitting at Fayetteville passed an act establishing a town on the lands of Thomas Dougan, embracing the new court house, and appointed Jeduthan Harper, Jesse Henley, Samuel Millikan, William Bell, and Zebidee Wood, commissioners of the town, and they named it Johnsonville.

Up to this time the town had assumed no definite shape. It had been floating about like Noah's Ark and none could tell with any degree of certainty where it would land. But now it is settled. The court house is built, the town is established by law and it has become inevitable that Johnsonville is to be the county site.'

Mr. Blair goes on to say that this was the cross roads of two highways, the one leading from Old Salem to Fayetteville and the other from Hillsboro to Salisbury. He also says that the town attracted capital, business and speculation, about seventy-five lots were purchased and improved and that in addition to the public buildings there were stores, hotels, bar rooms, smith shops, wood shops, shoe shops, hatter shops, and that Johnsonville became the great center of business and fashion. The county seat remained at Johnsonville until 1793 when it was moved to Asheboro.

It is never possible to mention the names of all those who have had a part in securing our liberties and in developing the resources that have made our country great. And it is difficult to know just what is fact and what is fiction.

Rev. E. W. Caruthers' History of North Carolina, published about 1850, says that the information which we have concerning some of the families who once lived in this section is such that one hardly knows what is reliable and what is not. If that were true a hundred years ago what shall we say now?

It might be said that the people in the Revolutionary days were so busy clearing fields and building houses and churches, as well as protecting themselves from the bands of marauding Tories under Col. David Fanning, that they did not write down much that they knew and did. In Bible times very little was written for something like thirty years after the founding of the Christian church. It might be said of almost every generation that one generation does the work and the next generation does the writing about it. But we do know that there were some outstanding people who lived in this community and we are here today to do honor to their memory. In fact, we have already waited all too long to pay our respects to them, so that those who come after us may know that the great deeds of our ancestors did not go unnoticed by us. Who are some of these families?

First, we will mention Thomas Dougan. Blair's History of Randolph county records the fact the Stephen Rigdon sold to Thomas Dougan in 1786 a tract of land comprising about six hundred acres and extending from Lack Creek to Deep river. Mr. Blair has this to say also : 'Col. Thomas Dougan lived at the Cross Roads (IronsCross Roads) and had a store there. He was a man of influence and culture and might be termed the chief among the mighty men of valor. He was captured at one time by Fanning and was taken out with a rope around his neck to be hanged, but through the intervention of some of Fanning's men who were friends of Dougan, Fanning was induced to release him. After the war he was elected a member of the legislature from Randolph county and served three terms in the senate.

Another family which played an important part in the development of Randolph county was named Welborn. This family was descended from Mrs. Mattie McGee Fell. According to the best information obtainable Jane McGee, daughter of Col. John McGee, and Martha McFarlane McGee, was married to John Welborn. This family is credited with having had ten children.

Many descendants of the original Welborn family became prominent but perhaps the one best known to a great many people of this section over a period of years was E. Clark Welborn who died at his home at Baldwin City, Kansas, a couple of years ago. In an article published in the Courier-Tribune of Asheville March 21, 1949, Mr. Welborn makes the statement that Mrs. Mattie McGee Fell was his great-great grandmother. It is fitting, therefore, that the name Welborn should appear on the marker which has been erected along with the name Fell.

While taking no laurels from the brow of any one, it is safe to say that Mrs. Martha McGee Fell was the most outstanding heroine who lived in the section during the Revolutionary days. For many years historians have marvelled at her bravery and her accomplishments. So many people have written about her that it is difficult to know which one to quote.

According to Carruthers History of the Revolutionary days, Martha McFarlane who was born in the southern part of what is now Alamance county married Col. John McGee, who was a large land owner on Sandy Creek in the northern part of Randolph county.

John McGee died either in 1773 or 1774. On March 6, 1779 Martha McGee, familiarly known as Mattie, was married to William Fell, the first sheriff of Randolph county and who owned a mill on Deep River some three miles above Randleman and now known as Walker's Mill.

To mention all of the daring experiences recorded concerning this brave woman would extend this paper far beyond reasonable bounds. All agree, however, that she was a practical nurse and that she ministered to many people, some far beyond her immediate neighborhood. On one occasion it is said that as she was riding horseback one of Col. David Fanning's men stepped out in the road before her and demanded that she stop, whereupon she pulled her

pistol out of its holder and pointed it at him and commanded him to walk in from of her horse. This he did until he arrived at her home. Not being able to contact any one else when she arrived at home the soldier slipped away and never returned.

But perhaps the most outstanding thing in her career was the fact that for three days she was the involuntary hostess of Lord Cornwallis who was commanding the British forces during the Revolutionary War. The battle of Guilford Court House was fought on March 15, 1781. While it was thought at first that the British were victorious, yet it was afterwards learned that their losses were such that they were not able to follow up what seemed at first to be a victory. On his way to Wilmington following the battle of Guilford Court House, Lord Cornwallis stopped at what was then the Pell mill and remained for three days. He took over the mill and ground grain for his men and horses, this grain having been confiscated wherever it could be found.

During these three days Lord Cornwallis stayed in the home of Mrs. Mattie Bell, whose husband was on some military mission to South Carolina. R. C. Welborn, in his article concerning his great-great grandmother, says that in her diary she says that Cornwallis was an unwelcomed, unwanted guest in her home, yet above all, he was a gentleman of the highest order. He dined at her table, ate coarse food, occupied her guest bedroom, talked freely of the task which he was trying to perform for the king, but that after seeing how the poverty stricken American citizens fought so valiantly for the love and freedom of their country he was losing faith in the justice of the King's cause and that he was praying for the day soon to come when he should be called back to England, his home and the home of the ancestors of Mattie Bell. It is said that Cornwallis, on leaving the Pell home placed in the hand of Mrs. Bell a goodly sum of money and invoked upon her and her country the Divine blessings.

In addition to being a nurse and a distinguished patriot, Mrs. Martha Bell is credited with being one of the founders of Old Union Methodist church which is located in the community in which she lived following her second marriage. This church, which was established in 1786 was one of the first Methodist churches to be established in this section, in fact any section, for the Methodist church in America came into existence with what is known as the Christmas Conference which was held in Baltimore, Maryland in 1784. The statement has been made many times that the first camp meeting ever held in North Carolina was held in Old Union Methodist church. Any way this church is greatly honored to be able to claim that one of its illustrious founders was Mrs. Mattie McGee Bell. And it is also fitting that the trustees of this church are also the trustees of the Bell graveyard.

And now, having said this much about some of the people who lived in this section, what else ought to be said? In answering this question it could be said truthfully that many who wrought nobly have not even been mentioned at all. It is always true that many who work the hardest get very little praise. How shall we honor properly all those who have had a part in developing our great country? We can honor their memory, first by finding out as much as possible about them and in the second place we can bestow honor upon them by doing our best to carry on where they left off. Very likely there were many things they wanted to do that they did not get done. Those things were left for us to do. When we lay down our work there will be many things we wanted to do that we did not get done. But all of us should so devoted ourselves to the task of making our communities what they ought to be as to guarantee that those who have gone before us shall not have lived in vain.
