

Original Naomi Mill, where the present (1972) J. P. Stevens is on Naomi Street. This picture was taken about 1900 or before, as the Mill was still using wood. Oscar Yow was the first to work with the Mill when it converted to using coal. He came in 1902. Many local persons cut and hauled wood from surrounding farms to supply the Mill, coming across the old Polecat ford up by the city water works and down to the Mill. The wood was stocked from the Mill up to the old Naomi Methodist Church with only room left for a team to go through.

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#### BLOOMFIELD SCHOOL

The 1900 roll of Bloomfield School had a registration of 161 pupils. The building was located where the present Wesleyan Methodist Church stands. It was a large building heated by a stove. A well nearby the building furnished drinking water.

The grading system of the school consisted of departments rather than the present-day grades. Bloomfield had three: A, B, and C. The teachers were: Miss Daisy Stewart Page, who married Dr. Walker of Asheboro, Miss Laura Stimson, the present Mrs. Hal Worth of Asheboro and Miss Florence Redding who married W. G. Bryant. Jule Weatherly was the professor.

#### Editor's Note:

The records in this book were written 15 years after Randolph County was organized, 11 years after the Revolutionary War ended (1775-1783).

William Bell (d 1821), Martha McFarlane McGee Bell (1735-1820), John Clark (1759-1816), Capt. William Clark (d 1836), Joseph Johnston (79 yr old in 1832), Daniel Merrill (bro. of Capt. Benjamin Merrill who was hung for treason at Hillsboro 1771), John Welborn (1757-1825), Thomas Dougan (d 1795) and many others were living during this time.

Business was good in old Johnstonville, new roads were being laid out in the county, persons living along the roads were appointed to work on the roads and by reading areas mentioned some may get an idea of neighbors and neighborhoods of Randolph distant kin.

There are 314 pages in this book. I have began at the beginning (some early pages missing) and selected different items for this article.

#### IN MEMORIAM

Joel Trogdon, son of Tyson Trogdon - memorial to his father. Joel Trogdon was a Methodist minister.

January 9, 1910

Tyson Trogdon was born October 24, 1823, and died, January 28, 1910, aged 86 years, 3 months and 5 days. He was born between Asheboro and Franklinville, near the church called Pleasant Cross, and lived there until he was married to the daughter of Rev. Isaac Coe in 1857. Then they moved to where I now live, and have always lived on the place until his death. To this union was born nine children. Of that number only five are living, the oldest being Mrs. H. M. Humble, the next being E. P. Trogdon, then I. L. Trogdon, John B. Trogdon, and Joel Trogdon, all of Randolph County, except I. L. Trogdon, who lives in Guilford County. On May 9, 1877, our mother died, being 41 years old, leaving father and eight children. In 1878 my father was married to Amanda Ellen Cox, daughter of the late Lindsay Cox and Margaret Cox. To this union were born seven children, but only five are living: E. E. Trogdon, of Charlotte; D. N. Trogdon, W. R. Trogdon, Girthy Trogdon, Myrtle Trogdon, all of Randolph County. Their are ten living children and 35 grandchildren to mourn their loss. Six children and both of his companions preceded him to the eternal World. I don't feel it necessary to say anything to applaud my father to the public of Randolph as he always lived among you, but as a child I feel like I owe much to my dear father's memory, and also my mother's. I want to say first that I ought to thank God for giving me parents of good standing. I feel like I could not praise my dear father too highly for having such a broad mind in choosing for me a mother. The first time he ever saw her she was praising her Savior in a special meeting her father was holding at Giles' Chapel under the old arbor, and his heart was drawn toward her then and never ceased until she became his companion, and I want to say her prayers and life have been a great inspiration to me, although she died when I was a tot. Then he chose for me a good stepmother, who too was called from time to eternity about three years ago, and now father is gone. Oh, how lonely I feel to think I have no parents now; but I want to say that I am indebted to my parents for all I am and ever hope to be in this world or the world to come, yet how little some children seem to appreciate their parents when the first commandment with promise is "Honor thy father and mother." Let me say to the children who may read this, honor your father and mother and obey them while they are living lest you regret it. My father professed faith in Christ at the old Free School house, if I mistake not, in a meeting conducted by Rev. Wm. C. Hammer, and I trust they are together today in a meeting where they will never part any more in that heavenly clime.

For some cause father never joined any church till seven years ago. He joined the M. P. church at Giles' Chapel, and was much interested till death. He was laid to rest in the cemetery at Mt. Tabor to await resurrection. May our Heavenly Father bless all the children and grandchildren and his many friends who are left behind, and may we, his children, never do anything to reproach his good name.

# HISTORY OF 46th INFANTRY CRISS-CROSSES FOUR STATES (From the files of the late Alton F. Culver) This is a brief outline of the five Spencer brothers' unit.

Their battles ranged from Virginia to Maryland, back to Virginia and South Carolina and again to Virginia where they eventually surrendered at Appamattox on April 9th, 1865.

The 46th North Carolina Infantry of the Confederate States of America was organized at Camp Mungum, near Raleigh in March 1862. The first action came in the Battle of Seven Pines on May 30 which was followed by the Seven Days Battle around Richmond.

The men of the 46th also fought at Bull Run and Chantilly and then into Maryland and the capture of Harper's Ferry, West Virginia, on September 16.

The next action for the 46th was on Sept. 18, at the Battle of Antietam and then followed by Fredericksburg on Dec. 13, where the 46th was in the Sunken Road at the foot of Mary's Heights during the six successive attacks by Burnside's Army.

From Fredericksburg to Wilmington, the 46th enjoyed a rest period. In April, 1863, the group went from Charleston, S. C. to Pocataligo, S. C., and then to Kinston on picket duty on the rivers.

June saw the 46th rushed to Richmond for the protection of the city during the Gettysburg campaign.

In October the 46th rejoined the Army of Northern Virginia at Madison Courthouse and on October 14, Cook's Brigade hit Warren's.

Union Army which was laying behind a railroad embankment at Bristoe Station, Va., and in less than 30 minutes the brigade lost 700 men of the 1,400 carried into the battle. Kirkman's North Carolina Unit, the only other troops sent in, lost 560 men in the same charge.

December saw the 46th at Mine Run, Va., and in Feb. of 1864 saw the unit relieved of picket duty along the Rapidan River and to winter quarters at Orange Courthouse, Va.

On May 5, 1864, Cooke's Brigade, being the leading Brigade of the Corps, struck Grant's Army and the Battle of the Wilderness had begun. In the fighting that followed that afternoon, the brigaders' loss was 1,080 out of 1,800 carried into the fight.

May 12, the Battle of Spotsylvania Courthouse followed with the "bloody angle." August 25 the 46th took part in the Battle of Reams Station and were stationed about the end of August in the trenches around Petersburg, Va. By the end of October the 46th was found on the extreme right of Lee's lines at Hatcher's Run. They remained in the trenches around Petersburg until the retreat towards Appamatox which started on April 2, 1865, with fighting going on all the way such as Yellow Tavern, Deep Creek and Fermville.

With their numbers cut to 97 men, the 46th and 27th outfits were sent to drive off a brigade of Sherman's Cavalry which was burning a wagon train,

but the two Regiments were so understrengthened they could do very little.

The surrender of the two units took place at Appomattox on April 9, 1865.

Other Randolph County men who served in Company F of the 46th were: Second Lieutenant R. D. McCotter, First Sergeant Isaac N. Branson, Second Sergeant F. Craven, First Corporal E. Tucker, and Privates R. T. Bean, J. W. Hancock, Noah Owens, Henry Tucker and Joseph F. Dunn.

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#### RANDOLPH COUNTY DURING THE CIVIL WAR

North Carolina seceded from the Union on May 27, 1861 and was received as a member of the Southern Confederacy. Being largely a farming state, it was a tremendous task to change from the care of its fields to a camp, yet within a year after it left the Union the State had nearly sixty thousand men in camp.

During this war Between the States, Randolph County sent to the front nine full companies -

and numerous other soldiers scattered among other regiments.

The Randolph Companies served throughout the war in the Army of Northern Virginia and were in many major battles. Their loss was heavy at Gettysburg.

At war's ending many of these men were wounded, dead, or in Northern prisons.

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### THEY GAVE GENEROUSLY: THEIR LIVES FOR CONFEDERACY

Five sons of a Randolph County family marched off to war over one hundred years ago. Three never to return, a fourth to die at home on furlough and the last to carry scars of battle until his death in his 91st year.

These five brothers, Lemuel, Wshington, Jesse, Edward and Nathan were the sons of George and Rebecca Spencer. Four enlisted the same day, March 12th, 1862 and were mustered into service on April 16th at Camp Mangum near Raleigh. The youngest, Edward, enlisted a year later, March 8th, 1863. The five were in Company F. 46th North Carolina Infantry C. S. A.

Washington was the first to die at the age of 20 on November 17, 1862. He died of pneumonia at Charlottesville, Va. and his body was brought home by brother Lemuel who was in the hospital suffering from wounds at the time.

Jesse was buried on the battlefield. He died at the age of 20 on December 26th, 1863 in Richmond Hospital and was buried at Fredericksburg, Va. His wounds came in the hip at the Battle of Fredericksburg on Dec. 13th.

Edward who was in the same company with his brothers died while home on furlough in early 1865. On sick leave, he was on the family farm cleaning out ponds though in a weakened condition. Family descendants say he went from pond to pond and drank of the waters of each, and that night took sick suddenly and died. He was buried in the family cemetery.

Nathan who joined the army at 27, died in battle at Bristoe Station in Virginia and left a sad legacy.

A faded tintype still in possession of the Spencer descendants tells the story of an unfulfilled love with a young lady, Mary Jane Cox, who later returned the tintype to the family. On the reverse side of the picture was this inscription:

"If youth and beauty could avail Nathan would not have died; Farewell for you so soon to leave Doth make my heart most truly grieve."

Lemuel, who enlisted at the age of 27, was the only survivor of war's rigors living until nearly 92 years of age and raising a family of eleven, eight girls and three boys.

After being mustered into service, Lemuel was detailed as a nurse at Drewry's Bluff, Va. in the camp hospital during June and July of 1862. From January of 1863 to November of 1863 he was home on sick furlough, and during this time promoted to 3rd Corporal. On May 5th, 1864 he was wounded in the Battle of the Wilderness and on July 20th again furloughed home from a Lynchburg, Va. hospital. On Dec. 22nd, 1864 he retired from service for disability and was placed in the invalid corps.

During the war Lemuels family lived with George and Rebecca Spencer. They moved to their own home when Lemuel returned to work the family farm.

The other brothers, too young to go to war, were Willis, who married

Martha Bean and George Henry, who married Tassie Sheffield. One daughter was born to the Spencers.

Rebecca Spencer, mother os the five boys, was accustomed during the war years to climb the stairs to a large second story room where the boys once slept. No doubt she said many prayers for the safety of her sons. One night she stood by Nathan's bed she heard his voice calling "Oh Mother" and three times it called. She had a premonition then of Nathan's death and leter came the news that he had died.

In a cemetery built on Spencer property, the first to be buried there was John Vanderford who was home from the war on sick leave. His family lived on the Roberson Yow place, later known as the Martin Yow farm. Vanderford reportedly borrowed a horse to ride to Asheboro in order to get his leave extended. The story goes that he was murdered by a man named Waters who was said to be a Yankee deserter and another man named Gallihorn who was a supposedly Confederate deserter.

The horse came back to the farm and the family immediately went out to search for Vanderford. It was on in the evening when they found his body. George Spencer gave permission for the burial in his cemetery. A military marker was placed at his grave.

It was said that Waters and Gallihorn paid for their crime. Gallihorn was staked and shot at Seagrove and Waters hanged in Asheboro. The story goes that Waters' parents traveling by wagon came from Indiana to see their son before he was hanged.

There are around thirty markers in the Spencer burying ground. All graves comprise the descendants of George and Rebecca Spencer except for the Confederate soldier J. J. Vanderford and a Negro infant whose parents lived in that area and had no burial place for their child. Vanderford was a member of Co. B, 52nd N. C. Inf. C. S. A.

This information was supplied by a granddaughter, Miss Lena Underwood a granddaughter of Lemuel Spencer who lives in the general vicinity of the Spencer home place.

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Note Concerning Vanderford:

Mrs. R. E. Brown (Sadie Vanderford Brown) daughter of J. A. Vanderford (deceased) of Eurlington, N. C. and granddaughter of John Vanderford who lived in Randolph County donated to the St. Paul Museum a part of the Confederate uniform which John Vanderford was wearing when he was murdered by deserters while on leave with his family near Seagrove.

Land and has forewarned your humble Petitioner and forewarned him from tiling the land, and is Determined to Drive him from the Sd. Land. And your humble Petitioner being a Poor, Harmless and inoffensive man, having bought sd. land at a very dear rate; whereas, aforetime said Thomas Maxwell pretended no right nor Claim to said land, your frumble Petitioner being a poor Dunkard and past Common Slow, both in words and axtions, but more especially he was he acknowledges was too slow, for when the land office was first opened the aforesaid Thomas Maxwell being of a cruel and Coveting disposition goes amedately and enters aforesd. land, and your humble Petitioner what through Ignorance and what through being too slow he neglected either entering his land or entering a Cavit against the man that had entered it, till the first three months wer out that was alowd for every one to Cavit in, that had any Ocation; therefore your humble Petitioner does humbly beg that your Excellency might be pleased to point out some way wherein he might be redrest and come to the right of his land again and he will ever think himself in duty bound to be thankfull to your Excellency for the Same.

We the subscribers hereof, do know asshuredly the right of the said land belongs to the above named John Crouse and we have known sd. Crouse a long time and we are satisfied that he is but a fine and very honest man.

"THE CAROLINA GOLD RUSH" By: Bruce Roberts McNally and Loftin, Publishers, Charlotte, N. C. - 1971 - 75 pages-2 of Bibliography.

Bruce Roberts, editor of the picture Collection for "The Face of N. C." has twice been named Southern Photographer of the year. In this book he has brought together for the first time a unique collection of drawings and photographs of the N. C. gold mining area.

From the discovery of a 17 pound gold nugget by a boy in Cabarrus County in 1799 until the 1800's, N. C. was the leading gold producing state in the union.

The Mines and Prospects pages (76-77) in the book, the map of the central pledmont region of N. C. and S. C. showing sites is worth the price of the book.
