

INFORMATION ON JOINING THE SOCIETY

Our society is a non-profit corporation, chartered under the laws of the state of North Carolina. Gifts to the Society are tax deductible. Membershipd are of several classifications. Individual (\$5.00 per year), Junior, (\$2.00 per year), Contributing (\$25.00 per year) and Substaining (\$50.00).

Aim: To preserve the St. Paul Church building and other buildings and sites within the Society's area. To establish a Museum and acquire, through gifts, articles and items pertaining to the life and times of the people of the Society's area. To collect historical and genealogical data for permanent record.

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e note language de la companya de l La companya de la co The first Marlboro Meeting House was erected sometime prior to 1797, for it is known that a building was already in use when the lot was conveyed to Friends by James Allen. In 1816, Marlboro and Salem Preparative Meetings requested to "hold a Monthly Meeting circular between them." Previous to this time both had been under the jurisdiction of Centre Monthly Meeting.

A committee, appointed by Centre Monthly Meeting to visit them, reported in favor of thrie request being granted. Western Quarterly Meeting, which was held at Spring, united with the request, and directed said Meeting to be opened at Salem Meeting House on the 7th day of 9th month, 1816, by the name of Marlborough Monthly Meeting. Joseph Hill, John Winslow, Jesse Towel, Joshua Chamness, Sarah Dixon, Hannah Thompson, Ann Hill, and Anna Peacock, were appointed from the different meetings in the Quarter to attend the opening of the same.

The following are names of some of those who composed the original membership of Marlborough Monthly Meeting: Rebecca Carter, Dougan Clark, Abigail Coffin, John Coffin, Jesse Davis, Mary Davis, Miller Davis, Delilah Dennis, Elizabeth Dennis, William Dennis, Peter Dicks, Ann Dicks, Huldah Elliot, Ruth Elliot, George Farlow, Michael Farlow, Stephen Henley, Annis Hinshaw, Benjamin Hinshaw, Jesse Hinshaw, Rebecca Hinshaw, Hannah Hinshaw, Eunice Hinshaw, Jacob Hinshaw, Sarah Hinshaw, Seth Hinshaw, Thomas Hinshaw, James Hodgin, Joseph Hodgin, Ruth Hodgin, William Jones, Hannah Justice; Nancy McCollum, Daniel McCrackin, Elizabeth McCrackin, Mary McCrackin, Robert McCrackin, and wife, Martha, Rachel Marmon, John Newlin, Sarah Newlin, Elizabeth Norton, Henry Powell, Mournen Powell, Isaac Spencer, Mary Spencer, John Stalker, Keziah Stalker, Elizabeth Symons, Matthew Simons, Sarah Simons, Lydia Swaney, Sarah Thornborough, Abigal Wilson.

William Dennis was appointed the first Clerk with Michael Farlow Assistant Clerk; the other clerks were Aaron Stalker, Joseph Newlin, and Enoch Farlow.

At the first Monthly Meeting, Robert McCrackin and his wife were recommended to the station of Elders, which was approved. Other Elders were Nancy Clark, Mary Farlow and Enoch Farlow. Jesse Hinshaw and Joseph Elliot were the first trustees of the Monthly Meeting.

In the 7th month, 1817, Peter Dicks and Dougan Clark were recommended to be in the station of ministers. None other is mentioned for minister until David Farlow in 1850. Others who followed were Nathan F. Spencer in 1872; David S. Farlow in 1866; Seth C. Barker in 1893; Michael A. Farlow in 1895; Michael C. Farlow a little later; Margaret Farlow in 1939.

In 1935 Edward B. Harris came as the first monister to be paid a salary. He served the meeting capably for seven years. York Teague followed him and served from 1944 to 1952. John M. Pipkin came next and was the first full-time minister. He stayed for seven years. Others who have served were Robert Melvin, and Baud Bulla. In 1959 Robert L. Medford became our minister and is still working very faithfully.

In 5th month, 1819, the meeting "taking under solid consideration the declining state of our Society appoints Dougan Clark, Peter Dicks, Robert McCrackin and William Carter, to visit the families of this meeting and labor therein as they may be abilitated, for the removal of these deficiencies among us."

In the early history of the Meeting much was said about the oppression of the people of color. In the minutes of 12th month, 1826, the Yearly Meeting required in their behalf, that Marlborough Monthly Meeting and Preparative Meeting raise the amount of \$88.54 to help remove them to free government. The states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, and Pennsylvania could receive them. Later sixty-three were removed at a cost of \$1093.81. When in later years and particularly in 1963, the question of segregation of the races became such a prominent issue, several meetings were held by interested members to discuss the question. For the most part they have never changed their views concerning the oppression of those of other races.

All through the minutes of the first few years there are complaints of using spiritous liquors to excess, for not paying debts, marrying contrary to discipline, for non-attendance, and deviating from plainness of dress. Later the meeting had to investigate and make a report of all who "used spiritous liquings toexcess, as a medicine, and not at all." At later dates, some of these matters especially the use of intoxicants and non-attendance at meetings have caused deep concern. In 1936 and again in 1942 contests on Prohibition were held by the younger people with the hope that a deeper interest might be aroused concerning this question. Marlboro Friends have repeatedly voiced their opposition to ABC stores in Randolph County and in North Carolina. Capital punishment has also caused much concern and in recent years letters have been written to those in authority voicing their feelings about this matter. Peace among the peoples of the world has always been a deep concern of the meeting. From time to time much visiting has been done among the members for non-attendance and some good results have been frlt, although at the present time there is quite a number of inactive members.

In 1829 Friends of the different Monthly Meetings, including Marlboro, were requested to labot in love and tenderness with those who had artificial grave stones erected in the grave yards and have them removed. The question arose again in 1831 and Peter Dicks, Aaron Lindsay, Seth Hinshaw, John Stalker, Dougan Clark, and Isaac Farlow were appointed to look after the matter, and also to act as a committee on education. The cemetery is now quite large.

Marlboro cont'd

Some years ago an additional three acres of land was purchased. It is well cared for. For many years D. Volney Davis and later Harvey Davis showed a great deal of interest in its up-keep. A house for the caretaker has been built on the Meeting House grounds. Within the bounds of this large cemetery are buried many notable Friends of the early days of out history in central North Carolina. Quite different from 1829, the graves are now marked by beautiful and expensive granite and marble monuments. The older section has but few markers and many of the graves are entirely lost. In 1948, a large monument to the Farlows was erected. There is also a monument to the Loflins. Hugh Loflin is said to be the first to be buried at Marlboro, in 1803.

In accordance with the general Quaker momement of 1829 to establish schools in every Monthly Meeting within the range of North Carolina Yearly Meeting, Marlboro Monthly Meeting attempted to do its share in contributing toward the work. All through the years it has been vitally interested in education.

In 10th month, 1838, the long spelling of Marlborough was changed to Marlboro.

The First-day schools were begun in 1857, according to the direction sent out from the Quarterly Meeting.

During the War between the States (Civil War) a committee was appointed to look after the Friends in Military camps, and a part of the committee went to Richmond, Virginia, to learn of Seth W. Loflin and Joshua A. Hill. Seth Loflin had died byt Joshua Hill had passed beyond the Federal Lines into Indiana, and after the surrender came back home to North Carolina. Others visited in the prison guard-house; they were Allen and Daniel Millikan, Jesse and William Hill, Henry Poole, and John A. Wall. They were encouraged to be faithful to the religious testimonies of Friends. The committee's expenses were paid by the Monthly Meeting to the amount of \$259.00. During succeeding wars many of our members have stood by their convictions as to military service.

The first statistical report was given in 1873. The first minute about tobacco shows that 109 cultivated it and 27 sold it.

Quite different from the early days of Marlboro Meeting many new activities are carried on. The first Missionary Society was organized in 1929. At present time there are two very active societies. Circle Number 2 has been instrumental in establishing a Scholarship Fund for the meeting. For some years the Quaker Men had an active organization. In 1942 a Memorial Association was started. Since that time a Memorial Service has been held annually the third Sunday in May. Also, in 1942 the meeting decided to start a Floral Tribute for its deceased members. A Youth Fellowship was begun in 1948. Through interest shown by some members, a Memorial Tribute Fund was

set up in 1960. Donations to this fund might be used for the Library, the Educational Building, the Cemetery, or a Scholarship Fund. A Daily Vacation Bible School has been held each year for quite a while. Since 1962 much training has been given to the three choirs. A church kindergarten was begun in 1964 and the next year a pre-kindergarten class was added. Each year an Easter Sunrise Service is held.

In 1954 the Meeting decided it was time to consider building a Minister's Home. A committee was appointed to look after this. A nice brick building was constructed a short distance from the Meeting House, and a Dedication Service was held May 1, 1960. Willis and Ethel Beeson gave the land for this building. John Pipkin was the first Minister to occupy this home.

Marlboro Monthly Meeting has served in the community in which it was established for a period of 169 years. Many changes and improvements have been made during these years both in the building and grounds. The first was probably the removal of the partition in the building for the holding of separate sessions. Later additional rooms were added to accommodate the Sunday School classes. In 1950 the old structure was remodeled. The main building is still of frame construction. In 1957 a basement for a new brick Educational Building was begun and in 1961 the Educational Building was completed. James E. Davis gave the first donation for the basement.

The membership of Marlboro Meeting in June 1965 was 340.

When we think of the Friends of past generations, their work, and their loyalty, we receive the courage and inspiration that will make Marlboro Meeting of Friends continue to grow throughout the years to come.

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THE SPENCER FAMILY

The name Spencer was founded by the Honorable John Spencer whose father was an earl connected with Parliament, in England. His duties required him to wear a short top coat that was called a Spencer, so he became known as Spencer and his family also. In olden times people had only one name but as the population increased it was necessary to have a family name. This name was sometimes chosen from their occupation. Hence the name Spencer is derived from the short coat or jacket.

Spencers in Randolph County were first recorded on a deed written in 1788 to Mr. William Spencer of Montgomery County from James Prenell. The tract of land being on Little River. Also 411 acres of land on a deed made to John Spencer from Abraham Peacock in 1797. In the year 1804 William Spencer deeded a tract of land on Little River to his son Johnson Spencer.

Johnson Spencer lived on his place on Little River and reared a large family. His daughter Tabitha married a Lucas and a second daughter also married a Lucas.

In 1848 Johnson deeded to his son George 373 acres on Fork Creek. He also gave him two slaves, one of which that son sold and the other remained in the community to a ripe old age and always said George Spencer was good to him.

George raised a family of seven sons and one daughter and built a house referred to as "The White House" and it was a stylish house for that time. He and his family lived well. He also owned many fine horses. He was considered an honest man and also a good neighbor and was willing to loan his horse when needed.

Five of his sons saw service in the Confederate States Army. Only Lemuel Spencer survived the was and he carried the scars of battle to his grave. He suffered a wound which gave him a choice of whether his arm would be permanently re-set in either a straight or crooked position. He chose a crooked arm so he could carry his baby when he came home.

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BOMBAY INSTITUTE WELL REMEMBERED by Don Wrenn

From Courier Tribune 1962

Some of the students at Bombay Institute would probably have to laugh at the school youngsters today with their fine cars and excellent transportation but who miss school due to snow.

Bombay Institute has long since ceased to exist except in the minds and hearts of the remaining folks around here who attended the two-room school located below Farmer towards Albemarle.

Snow or flooding creeks failed to cancel school and the students who had to walk through miles of snow and bed weather to get to their classes can tell you this.

The Institute first opened its doors in the fall of 1900 and along with a similar school at Why Not was considered the best in Randolph County.

Land for this school was given by Frank Kearns while most of the money to build the school was raised through subscriptions, with the county aiding to some extent.

Students to Bombay Institute came from as far away as Stokes County.

Probably one of the most memorial days for the school was the day Governor Charles B. Aycock delivered the commencement address to the graduating class of 1903.

Mrs. Grace Brown Johnson who attended the school and still lives in the same community declares:

"We never knew a student to leave this school that went there any length of time and was mentally right that could not read or write ... some of the students had to walk four miles to get to the school house."

The girl students had their side of the school rooms and the boys had theirs. This ran true on the school grounds also.

Exercises included town ball, a form of baseball; someone hit the ball and everyone ran.

Other forms of recreation included: jumping rope with a grapevine, eroquet and bull pen.

The little girls would have their playhouses in the edge of the woods near the school grounds.

Each day school was opened with Bible reading and prayer.

Mrs. Johnson points out that the students were taught to be honest to themselves, to their fellow comrades and to God.

Students who failed to live up to the standards of the school and who refused to obey the teachers were expelled and sent home.

Today the modern schools have maids and janitors to clean up, but girl students at Bombay Institute did the dusting and cleaning themselves.

Says Mrs. Johnson, "Each morning four girls were appointed to sweep and dust the school while four boys were selected to get the wood for the school stove.

The school day concluded about 4 p. m., and the students were released to go home or to their respective boarding places.

Pay checks for the principal of the school amounted to \$30 per month while the assistant principal or instructor was paid \$20 per month.

The Bombay School calendar called for the following:

Fall term, August 19, classification. November 28, Thanksgiving Holiday. December 21, 7:30 p. m., Christmas entertainment.

Spring term, begins December 30, May 22, final examinations begin. May 29-30, commencement.

In a booklet published by the school somes the following information:

"Bombay Institute is situated seventeen miles southwest of Asheboro, twenty-two miles north of Troy. It is surrounded by one of the best farming communities. Early has two mails per day, stores, etc., in fact everything necessary for students. There is ample room for boarders near the institute. Preaching and Sunday School at the Institute every Sunday.

"Our rules must be obeyed. However, we believe in placing the students on their honor. Should anyone persist in breaking our rules punishment will follow. We are not running a reformatory and we desire no youth whose moral standing will be injurous to others. Profane or indecent language is not allowed on school grounds.

"Two good literary societies are run in connection with the school; one for boys, one for girls.

"Good board can be obtained for \$6 per month. Students can rent rooms and board on a cheaper plan. Tuition is from \$1 to 3.50 per month. No fees of any kind.

"Three medals are offered for the year 1901-1902. One for best oration, one for best declaration, one for best recitation. A prize will be given for best attendance during the year."

The courses of study included: First year, first reader, spelling, writing, number exercises, one dollar per month.

Second year, second reader, spelling, writing, Primary Arithmetic. Costs one dollar per month.

Third year, third reader, spelling, writing, arithmetic, supplementary lessons in reading, language, and geography. Costs \$1.25 per month.

Fourth year, fourth reader, spelling, writing, arithmetic, geography, English Grammar. Costs \$1.50 per month.

Fifth year reading, writing, spelling, arithmetic, English Grammar, North Carolina History, geography, Costs \$1.50 per month.

Sixth year, spelling, and defining, arithmetic, English History, Latin, grammer, U. S. History, physical geography, physiology, civics, algebra. Costs two dollars per month.

Seventh year, algebra, English History, Latin, Grammar, composition and Rhetoric and Roman Mythology. Costs \$2.50 per month.

Eighth year, Rhetoric and Literature, General History, algebra, Caesar, with Grammar and composition, physics, Botany. Costs \$3.00 per month.

Noneth year, Geometry, French History, German, Cicero, and Virgil with composition, chemistry, astronomy. Costs \$.3.50 per month.

J. M. Brown, principal of the school, in the booklet declares that:
"The above is given as the regular course of study. Supplementary work is added throughout the entire course.

"No deduction from tuition rates except for protracted sickness. Bills must be paid monthly unless a different agreement has been previously made. Those who compete for honors must settle or provide for all their bills before commencement day.

"Students should enter school the first day. Without regular attendance no student can make satisfactory progress..."

A tattered article, carefully clipped and preserved from the 1906 edition of The Courier, predecessor of the Courier-Tribune, reports on the Bombay Institute commentenebt exercises:

"The commencement exercises of the Bombay Institute occurred Friday. The day's program was well arranged and the efforts of those who took part were highly complimented by the large crowd that had gathered from miles around to witness the exercises.

"The program during the morning consisted of declamations by the young men pf the school and recitations by the young ladies, interspersed with music by the

New Hope orchestra, which added much to the diversion of thought suggested by the different declamers and reciters. The orchestra is composed of Mssrs. S. T. Lassiter, director and planist; Bernard Varner and Walter Lyndon, violinists. Eck Loflin and Reggie Varner, cornet; Carl Lyndon, trombone; Walter Hill, tenor violin; Rufus Lassiter, base violin; Floyd Lassiter and J. L. Cranford, mandolin; and Tony Johnson and Carl Nance, banjo.

"N. L. Cranford, formerly of Bombay, but now one of Winston-Salem's most enterprising and public spirited business men had offered a gold medal for the best declamation which was won by Byron Ingram as declaimer.

"The reciter's medal, given by Prof. J. H. Robertson, the principal, was won by Miss Tura Cameron."

NOT DATED, BUT AMONG PAPERS OF 1771 and 1772

To: His Excellency Josiah Martin his Majesty's Captain General. Governor, etc... and to the Honorable the Members of His Majesty's Council, Mr. Speaker and Gentlemen of the House of Assembly.

The petition of the Subscribers inhabitants of Guilford County Humbly Sheweth: That your petitioners is deprived of that natural and profitable privilege of catching fish on Deep River as formerly by the Chanel being stopt by several mill Dams being made quite across said River to the Great Hurt of many poor familys who depended on said fishing for great part of their living, it being well known that no river of its size in the province afforded a greater quantity of excelant Shad and other fish. We therefore Humbly pary that you through your great goodness would Condescend to pass a law in our favour so far as to oblige the owners of said dams to afix proper flood gated in their dams from the mouth of said River to Field and Dicks Mill above the trading path and them to keep open at proper times from the tenth of February to the tenth of April that the said inhabitants may in some maner be Restored to their former privilege of Catching fish and your petitioners as in Duty Bound shall ever pray.
